# Queensland Mental Health and Drug Advisory Council Meeting Communique 7 December 2015

The Queensland Mental Health and Drug Advisory Council convened the last meeting for 2015 at South Brisbane on 7 December 2015. The meeting was followed by a morning tea event to meet and thank stakeholders for their support in reforming the mental health and alcohol and other drug systems. The stakeholder event was also attended by the Honourable Cameron Dick MP, Minister for Health and Minister for Ambulance Services.

Ms Michelle Edwards, an experienced Consumer and Carer Consultant from the Gold Coast Hospital and Health Service attended the Council meeting to offer her perspective.

The primary focus of the meeting was to reflect on the Council's 2015 priority areas and identify areas for consideration in 2016. The Council agreed to refer the following three areas for the incoming Council's attention:

- 1. Rural and remote service provision
- 2. Issues for culturally and linguistically diverse Queenslanders
- 3. Integration of mental health and drug and alcohol services.

### Council member achievements

Since the last Council meeting held on 19 October 2015, several members have been involved with a number of important projects including:

- Mr Luke Terry successfully securing \$1 million of Federal Government funding to invest in the Vanguard Laundry Services social enterprise located in Toowoomba. This investment ensures this initiative becomes a reality.
- Professor Gracelyn Smallwood's attendance at the first meeting of the Townsville
  Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Suicide Prevention project reference group hosted by
  the Queensland Mental Health Commission. The project will scope current service
  models, barriers for accessing services and options for improvement for Aboriginal and
  Torres Strait Islander young people at risk of suicide within Townsville.

## **Council membership**

This was the final meeting for several members whose terms expire in February 2016 and for the Council Chair, Professor Harvey Whiteford. Professor Whiteford has resigned from the Council, effective 29 January 2016, to take up an exciting opportunity with the United Nations.

Members of the Council and the Queensland Mental Health Commissioner acknowledged the Chair for his guidance, support and leadership since the Council's establishment. The Chair thanked the members for their support and in particular the Deputy Chair, Ms Jan Kealton for her

role as the Acting Chair, from time to time. Professor Whiteford shared his personal reflection that individuals should aim to leave the mental health, alcohol and other drugs system in better shape than they found it.

It is anticipated that the appointment of new Council Chair and members will be announced by the Minister for Health in early 2016.
